TYRE CARE FOR EVERY BUSINESS

At a recent staff training day held in Queenstown we were given a very important update on the new Health and Safety laws coming in.

From that discussion we all agreed that some operators – from the small, two van, businesses right through to the larger truck companies still don't have a regular tyre maintenance program in place to go with their health and safety program so we thought it was timely to let you know how we can help.

Tyre maintenance has never been more important, not only for the lowering of tyre and fuel costs but also under the new Health and Safety laws.

So, who's responsibility is it? The owners, the drivers or tyre supplier! We believe it takes a team effort from everyone.

Don't leave your tyre care to chance – safety is everyone's responsibility

With most vehicles going onto yearly WOF we are now seeing the effects of this – tyres with steel belts showing, under inflation and bald tyres. All these factors add unnecessary costs to your bottom line profits and compromise safety.

We will work with you to implement a tyre maintenance program that works best for your business.

Our maintenance programs include pre-scheduled vehicle checks (depending on your operation once a week or once a month). During the vehicle check we monitor such things as;

- * Tread depths of each tyre
- * Tyre pressures
- * Tyres wearing evenly
- * Correct pattern
- * Correct load & speed rating
- Provide wheel nut indicators for light and heavy trucks so the driver can detect loose wheels at a glance.
- * And more...

OF THE BEST WINTER DRIVING TIPS

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GET YOUR VEHICLE 'WINTER READY' Book your vehicle in for a service to check

anti-freeze levels, wiper blades, filters and battery condition.

TYRES

Make sure your tyres are properly inflated and have a minimum 3mm tread. Overinflation can reduce the gripping action of tyres while lack of tread increases stopping distances. If you're going to be driving in the snow, make sure you have the correct tyres.



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GOOD VISIBILITY

Winter often means reduced visibility, so allow additional travel time and make sure you can see out of windows and mirrors. Use a proper windscreen scraper or de-icer to remove ice from your vehicle. Don't use warm water; it may cause your windscreen to crack.

KNOW WHAT TO EXPECT

The winter sun is low in the sky so be prepared for sun-strike and keep your front and rear screens clean. Black ice is difficult to detect, so be especially vigilant after very cold, settled nights.

BRAKING AND ACCELERATING

When accelerating, push the accelerator pedal gently. If you do sense wheel-spin, ease back on the pedal immediately until you feel the tyres grip again. Apply the same principle when braking. Brake gently at first then increase the pedal pressure progressively. You can brake quite hard as long as the application is smooth.



HANDY KIT

Stock your car with a first aid kit, fire extinguisher, and should you need to change a tyre – tools, a ground cover, raincoat, gloves and a multi-tool. An emergency reflective triangle and a high visibility vest ensure you're easier to spot if stranded on the side of the road.

COLD WINTER? HOT DEAL!

If your car is on a 12 monthly Warrent of Fitness check, then there's a 33% chance your tyres would fail a WOF today.

We commonly see these issues from vehicles that have a current WOF:

- Under inflated tyres
- Lacking tread
- * Worn unevenly
- * Steering wheel not straight

These 4 tyre issues are costing you money and they are not safe on the road.

SLIGHTLY SPICED PUMPKIN SOUP

Cold winter days call for warming recipes and we think this Slightly Spiced Pumpkin Soup is just what you need to fire up the tastebuds. It's easy to make and delicious for a work day lunch or as an entrée to your evening meal.

You will need:

- 2 onions, finely diced
- 1 pumpkin, cut into small cubes (skin removed)
- 1 tin of whole peeled tomatoes
- 3 cloves of garlic, peeled
- and crushed1 teaspoon of cumin
- 1 teaspoon of cumin
- 1 teaspoon of crushed chilli1 red capsicum (roasted
- and diced)2 litres of chicken stock
- 1 tin of coconut cream

Method:

In a pot put two tablespoons of oil and lightly fry the onions, garlic, cumin and chilli for 2– 3 minutes. Next, add the pumpkin, coating it in the flavours.

Add the tomatoes and stock, followed by salt and pepper to flavour.

Simmer for 1.5 to 2 hours until the pumpkin is fully cooked.

Add coconut cream and simmer for 3 minutes. Then blitz in the blender and serve.
